they lived along the banks, then they moved to the*


*hinee yiisiihi' beesoowu' ne'cei'sooni'i hibii3hiinino

Black Hills, Casper, places like that and*

*nih'ee3ebce' eeckoohu3i' heetko'einooni' nehe'
they would go back home to Estes Park, that is*

*nih'iitcecinsi'i noh beniiceni'i ne'nih'ii
where they stayed for the winter and when summer
came they would*

*woowo'wuuhu3i' tih'ii3ookhoo3i' hii3einoonin
move around following the buffalo,*

*heniisnoh'oono3i ne'nihiicen3oo3i'
then they would dress the buffalo after killing it,*

*nih'iibistonouneihit nehe'nih'eeneisiine'etii3i'.
they used every part of the buffalo, that is how they
lived.*

*Wohei, ne'cessis nihi' neenoxoono' heesiine'etiino'
hi'iihi'*

*Okay, that's when our way of life became more
dangerous because*

*tohnihi'nee woo3ee3i' nih'oo3ou'u wohei
there were more white people now, well*

*ne'neyeisisise3i', hiinono' wuuhnenno' noowuuhu'
that's when they parted, the Southern Arapahos
moved*

*hee3ebsee3i' noh beesoowu'u'nenco' ne'cei3iihi3i'
south and the Great Lakes people came to the*

*bei'i'einiicie noh nouuhoowu' noh ne'nih'iitniiseekuu'u
Casper area and armento area and that's where they
had*

*hoseihoowu'u ceese' hitesiino' ceese' hinono'eino'
two Sundances, one was Cheyenne, the other
Arapahos*

*noh nuhu' niisiisiyeiniixonee3i' nih' etbisiiitoneino'
he'ne
and these Shoshones were going to attack us, then
they*

*niitwootou'u nuhu' niibóootno. Wohei neeneheesiini
heard these songs. They said, let it go,*

*heetbi'co'ookootiino' nuhu' niibóootno
we'll just take these songs back home*

*heetihtonounowuno' nuhu' niibóootno heehehkon'i' so
we can use these songs they said to themselves,*

*'oh hoowee'inowuu tih'oonoyooohobeihi3i'
heneihcee3too3i'*

*but they didn't know they were being watched, they
would have made a mistake*

*hibiisiitoneino'ohk heneihnoo'oohoono'
if they attacked us, we would have killed them all,*

*heetniiseekuu'u nee'eesih'i'inoo' nuhu'
where two Sundances lodges stood is what it is
called.*

*Wohei, he'iicxooyeiniihi' he'ne'ce'bisiitonei3i'
nuh'uuno*

Well, sometime later they were attacked again by the

*sii'siiyeiniixoneehiiho' noh beni'ineno hinee
Shoshones and soldiers at the*

*konouwoo'oe' ni'i3eihiinoo' wohei ceese'inen
place you call Lost Cabin, well, one man*

*he'ihwoowoxo'oó3eih noh ne'cihnootoso'ei'it
was blessed with medicine and he rounded up the*

*woxhooxebii, hee3eb noho'oeso'noot teesi'
horses, he chased them to the top,*

*ne'eeneitooxobei3i' ne'cih'oowkoohuuhei3i'
then they got their horses, then they rode down,*

*ne'iyiihowoo3i' wohei ne'hooxohoe
then they chased them, now it was their turn*

*cesisbi'owoo3oo3i', he'ne'cihtokohni3i', noh
neeceeno'*

*to start beating them in the battle, that's when they
started running from them and the chiefs*

*tootou'eebi3i' ciibehneenonihe' bi'touninoo3e' wohei
warned them, don't kill them, just capture them, now*

*he'ne' cihkoo'ouute' nuhu' nihwoonno'otehei3i'
there was just a big cloud of dust, these that were
tough before,*

*ne'cihbixonesei3i', wotii to'oeneehiiho'
they were now crying while being chased, just like
little pups*

*he'ihbixonotouuhno' cei3iihi' wohei nehe' nihi'soo'.
they were crying and screaming coming this way,
okay, that's how it was.*

*Wohei he'iicxooyeinihi' nehe' teeb3ee3eit
Well, sometime later, this man Black Coal
ne'cihnoxuuteixohoot he'iitoxni3i' hinono'eino nuhu'

*noh nii'oooot. Nehe' heeniibeet ne'cihwoonno'uuhut
and he consented. Sharp Nose then moved over here*

*nohkuuhu' hini' hoo3o'o' hinono'eino, niis
along with the rest of the Arapahos, we*

*nih'oontootowuno' nuhu' biito'owu', nee'eh'ee3ee
paid for this land twice, that's why*

*neentoono' hiit, heihoowuni' ce3eso'nein wohei
we are living here, they cannot chase us away. Okay,*

*neenee' neetoxunihii'ni', neihoow
we've said enough, we will not*

*beetbisoo3itootowube 'heesii3oobee'.
and don't want to tell the whole story how true it is.*
